In a negative sentence use it in this way: Person + don't/doesn`t/didn't + want + object pronoun + to infinitive. In a question: Do/Does/Did + person + want + object pronoun + to infinitive.
1 Positive sentence example: I want him to explain the exercise. Negative sentence example: He doesn't want me to go to the party. Question example: Did your Mum want you to phone her?
