

## Past Simple Revision (Questions & Negations) (2)



Practise negations and asking questions in the Past Simple!

1 In order to form a negation in Past Simple you can also use an auxiliary verb (was, were) or a modal verb (could). In that case the negation is formed with "not. For example: I wasn't/was not at the football match yesterday.

To form a question put was, were or could at the beginning of the sentence. For example: Were you at home last night?

Be careful: Use "were/weren't" for you, we, they \_\_\_ you have a nice evening yesterday? Was O Do O Did \_\_\_\_\_ have time to cook dinner last night.
