

## **Present Perfect Continuous (2)**



Come practise the present perfect continuous!

• We use the present perfect continuous when we want to say that something started in the past and is still continuing now.

The present perfect continuous is formed with "has/have been" + "the ing-form of the verb" (present participle). For example: I have been watching the TV series for a month now.
